Appointments

Whenever possible all non emergency medical and dental appointments should be made outside of the school day. We appreciate that this is not always possible especially for hospital appointments, however we do ask that you bring proof of all appointments for our records. We also request that if your child needs to attend an appointment during the school day that they come into school as normal and be picked up and dropped off as soon as they are finished. If your child's attendance is below 90% then medical appointments or Illness will not be authorised without medical evidence.

We strongly value the links between school and home and appreciate your support in helping your children achieve good attendance.

As a school we celebrate good and improved attendance individually, as a class and as whole school throughout the year.




At Yew Tree we want all our pupils to reach their potential. To get the best out of school and all it has to offer, children need to come to school every day and be on time.

Days off school add up to lost learning



While we aim for all children to be in school and on time everyday, we appreciate this is not always possible.

Our school target for attendance is 96%.

his means that even if your child is absent for up to 7.5 days throughout the school year then they can still achieve the minimum 96% or more attendance. If your child is unable to attend school then parents/ carers must contact the school immediately. In the absence of any contact the school is required to complete a first response home visit.

Holidays From School

Taking children out of school for holidays can have a negative impact on their education. At Yew Tree we do not authorise any term time holidays unless there is exceptional circumstances. We work closely with the School Attendance Service (SAS) and unauthorised holidays during term time as well as irregular attendance may result in a penalty notice being issued.

Children whose attendance falls below 90% are recognised as being Persistent Absentees (PA).

Their attendance will be monitored closely and may result in the School Attendance Service becoming involved. Please let Mrs Swann know if there is any way we can support you or your child getting to school.

Our school day at Yew Tree

Every school day has two sessions which means two registration marks, **9am** and **1pm**.

We have a Soft Start to our school day, so school gates open at **8.45am** and close at **9am**.

Children arriving between 9 –9.15am will be marked as late (L).

Children arriving after **9.15am** will be marked as late after registration (U) and will lose their morning session mark which will affect their overall attendance.

Getting to school on time everyday is important not just academically but it also helps your child start their day positively.

Illness

While we understand that children will get sick we want parents/carers to ensure they are too ill to attend school before keeping them at home. Minor illnesses like colds, headaches and coughs do not always mean the child needs to stay home. If your child feels unwell in the morning but begins to feels better throughout the day then please bring them into school as they will still receive their afternoon mark and not miss out on school unnecessarily.
