- Discuss the names of the plates with your class and some countries and continents that are found on each tectonic plate.
- Explain what plate boundaries are and how they can cause/create volcanoes.
- Show diagrams of the three main plate boundaries. Discus the differences with your class.
- Show the next slides detailing pictures of Oreo biscuits making the tectonic plate boundaries.
- Explain to your class that volcanoes are found all over the world and there is a slight pattern to where they are found. Can they see it?
- Ask your children to predict what the 'ring of fire' might be and show the world map that details the ring of fire and what it is.

Foundation Subjects (if applicable for this term)

Art/DT

To create a sculpture in the style of sculptor Sokari Douglas Camp

- I can neatly cut out and arrange sections of a sculpture
- I know about the work of Sokari Douglas Camp

Sokari Douglas Camp is a Nigerian sculptor who has gained huge recognition in recent years. Her sculptures are all influenced by her Nigerian background and often include a political message. Many are made from welding metals and reused waste materials, such as the project shown in this link: 'Sokari Douglas Camp – 'Europe Supported by Africa and America", which includes petrol nozzles.

The sculpture shown in this link: 'Sokari Douglas Camp – 'All the World is Now Richer (Memorial Proposal)" depicts series of slave figures from the trans-Atlantic slave trade, from each of which a message spreads forward, such as "We were sold, bought and used", "We survived" and "All the world is now richer". The message is like the shadow cast by the figure.

Key questions

- How did slave owners stop slaves from running away?
- What must it have been like to have to wear chains and manacles

Making

The sculptures will be made up from reused materials, creating the shape of the words.

To ensure the letters are roughly uniform in size, cut the cardboard packaging (cereal box/cardboard box etc) into equal rectangles; 25cm X 15cm is a good size, but you may want to halve this depending on the space you have available for display or indeed the amount of cardboard available, as pupils will need one piece per letter.

Draw the block letters onto the pieces of card – one letter per piece – taking care to ensure that letter fills as much of the card as possible

before cutting it out carefully. Once the letters are cut out, lay them in order on a flat surface, making sure that they are in a straight line, before gluing a line of ribbon across the top of the letters and another piece along the bottom. Ensure that the glue is completely dry before painting the letters black.

The words will make an impressive display on their own, but using a digital camera will help emulate the style of Sokari. You can then be photographed standing with the black lettering flowing away from your feet so that you, in effect, become part of the sculpture.
