Bikeability – Y5/6 – W/b Monday 29th Jan

Bikeability is the government's national cycle training programme. It helps children learn practical skills, as well as essential life skills, and understand how to cycle on today's roads.

Bikeability gives everyone the confidence to cycle and enjoy this skill for life.



Beyond mastering the art of cycling, it cultivates independence, social skills and a sense of wellbeing.

Following Level 1 skill development, children will venture out onto the surrounding roads with the trainers, to demonstrate their cycling proficiency, showcasing the practical application of the skills they acquired.

This training enhances children's ability to respond to risk, fostering increased confidence. This not only contributes to improved physical health but also enhances mental wellbeing, allowing children to enter the classroom with heightened attention spans and engagement.
